The amended code adds the position of Chief Operating Officer to include the appropriate disclosure categories. The amendment carries out the purposes of the law and no other alternative would do so and be less burdensome to affected persons.

- 4. Will not result in any nondiscretionary costs or savings to local agencies.
- 5. Will not result in any costs or savings in federal funding to the state.
- 6. Will not have any potential cost impact on private persons, businesses or small businesses.
