I. Welcome

- A. Heather Barnhart, Assistant Principal, provided a welcome to parents, caregivers, students and staff thanking them for their attendance and we are so grateful to provide awards to our students.
- B. Heather Barnhart asked staff to introduce themselves in the chat with their position
- C. Heather Barnhart shared the importance of parent/caregiver attendance and feedback. III. LCAP

- A. Jenna Unis, Principal, walked through explaining what LCAP is and our credit completion goals. Clarified that our schools are public schools and that the LCAP is required by every school in California and how we are required to spend funding that directly benefits students. Reviewed that LCAP is based on feedback and how funds will be used to improve outcomes for all students.
- B. Current 4 LCAP Goals: Increase Academic Progress, Students will Gain Skills for College and Career Readiness, Increase Student Retention, Increase Educational Partner Engagement
- C. Focused on Educational Partner Engagement and commits assembled to support this goal. Expanding current partnership.
- D. Reviewed visual explaining current data regarding LCAP goals infographic including Story, Budget, and Highlights (including charter, enrollment, student demographics)
